January 10, 1901 registered letter sent from Spokane to Dresden, Germany. The red "EXCHANGE" label was required on registered mail to foreign countries from 1883 to 1911, and listed the US Exchange office that it went through—this one in New York City. **18 cents postage paid**: 10 cents for a one ounce letter and 8 cents to register it.
